A huge welcome back to Mrs Blowers who returned this Thursday. Mrs Richardson will still be working in Crickets class on a Wednesday morning.


Online Little Wandle Books



Communication, Language and Firel Firel Firel Year 2 Mathematical Development Literacy **Autumn 2 2023** Welcome to our new topic which will begin with a fire launch day and we will have a fire crew visit in the sec-ond week. Our focus is History and investigating the Great Fire of London and looking at how much safer houses are today. In Literacy we will be focussing on poetry. We will be starting by thinking about fire and fireworks as part of our Fire launch day. ipils will be taught to: Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any given number, forward or backward. We will then look at the poems Crackle Spit and November Nights and create a performance of ore of the poems before writing our own poem about fire usin the structure of the poem Crackle Spit. Identify and describe properties of 2D shapes, includ-ing the number of sides and symmetry in a vertical line. Identify 2D shapes on the surface of 3D shapes, for example a circle on a cylinder and a triangle on a pyra-mid. We will sequence and recount the main events of the Great fire of London an detail an explanation of how fire started and spread. FLASHLIGHT Recognise, find, name and write fractions for 13, 14, 24 and 34 of a length, shape, set of objects or quantity Finally we will look at the wordless picture book Flash Light by Lizi Boyd and write a narrative to tell the story. · Read and write numbers to at least 100 in numerals and Guided reading and spelling, grammar and punctuation · Compare and order numbers from zero up to 100 using Personal, Social and Emotional Spiritual Moral and Cultural Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from development learning We will continue to focus on our spiritual, moral and cultural development through assemblies and class sessions and a focus on school rules and setting our own rules for the year. In our Religious education sessions our key concept is "Journey's End". We will be considering different journeys and the importance of the journey's and for Christians through nativity stories and the story of Baboushka. In our PSHE lessons we are focussing on keeping safe. We will be learning: · Given a number, identify one/ten more and one/ten What it means to keep safe. Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pic-torial representations and mentally, To identify different people who can keep them safe. Looking at the British Value 'The Rule of Law' we will discuss why there are laws in place (Such as wearing a seatbelt) that keep us safe. Solve one-step problems that involve addition and sub-tractions, using concrete objects and pictorial represen tations. We will be talking about their own responses to journey's end in their experiences. We will identify how different journey's ends relate to their lives. We will identify and talk about different journey's ends. We will recognise the journey's end in the Christmas Birth Narrative and we will talk about the importance of the journey's end to Christians. As a final piece we will then chose a place or activity and we will be creating a leaflet of rules for keeping safe e.g. How to keep safe at the park. Interpret and construct simple pictograms, tally charts, block diagrams and simple tables. Ask and answer simple questions by counting the num-ber of objects in each category and sort the categories by quantity.

Science and Environment Art and Design / Music Physical Development In Art lessons our focus will be Winter pictures. We will begin by exploring colour mixing and we will name the primary colours and will use these to mix secondary colours and areate our own colour wheels. We will look at warm and cool colours, and how we can use these to create an effect. This term we will be using cool colours to create a wintery feel. In Science lessons this term we will be building on our prior knowledge of animals, including humans. We will learn about life cycles, food and growth, healthy living, and food chairs in animal groups. In our weekly PE sessions with Club Sport, we will be focussing on football. We will look at ball skills and ball control. As well as looking at team techniques and how to attack and defend. In our sessions with our class teacher we will be focussing on dance and using a video on the Great of London acreated by a group of Year 5 children inspiration. We will plan a sequence of dance relat the fire. We will video our own dances so we can evaluate and improve them. In addition to this, we will be beginning our seasonal lon gitudinal study to see how our school changes through the seasons of the year. We will be creating our own season scrapbooks to record our findings. We will then look at the work of Van Gogh's starry night pointing for inspiration, discussing our thoughts on the piece and experimenting with swirls and spladges to imitate Gogh's Starry Night affects. We will build on this by companing to the winter Tree and choosing elements that inspire us to put towards our final creation—our own Christmas card paintings! In our music sessions we will be learning Christmas song in preparation for our Christmas Play and celebrations. We will also be responding to, recognising and identifying getting louder and quieter (dynamics) by listening to mu-How you can help at home? History Computing Talk about safety—look out for signs such as fire exits when out and about. Test your smoke alarms as a family and talk about other rules that keep us safe e.g. making sure you can see mum and dad at the park. In History we will be studying the events of the Great Fire of London. We will be using the Hampshire Six Step mequiry approach to teaching this unit. This allows children to find information and draw their own children to that intervation are area there own conclusions. Other sources are then introduced to see if they add to or change their ideas. In the Great Fire of London stary we will look at how the fire started and the circumstances that lead to the fire spreading so quickly. We will compare fire fighting techniques then and now and look at how building construction and fire fighting has changed. We will also be making appropriate videos for a specific purpose, related to our topic of Fire. Firel We will be learning about how we can use captions, tools and sound to annotate digital pictures. We will be then be learning how to manipulate an image in an Art pookage to create our very own personalised Christmas photograph. We will have our monthly homework tasks- the first in November is poetry themed and the December task is computer themed.



Poppy Appeal 2023




Once again be supporting the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. I hope you have had a chance to look at the Poppies on the school gates!
